Further, epidemiological evidence from well-conducted investigations has shown no causative link between carbon black exposure and the risk of malignant or non-malignant respiratory disease in humans. The nitrogen substituted aromatic

in this product gave positive results for mutagenicity in an Ames Assay study while two other mutagenicity studies proved negative.
